Bonnell received an unexpected email and phone call from the White House with an invitation to join President Trump for a tax reform roundtable discussion. Several days later, he and Mortgage Processor Anita Jones joined President Trump, state officials and other business leaders in White Sulphur Springs before an audience of several hundred people to share their stories.

“To be honest, when I received the first White House email I didn’t think it was real,” commented Bonnell. “However, when a follow-up call soon arrived, along with more instructional emails, it all became surreal. This is an honor for Citizens Bank to be recognized by the President of the United States for our investment in our staff, and the customers and communities we serve.”

Bonnell shared with President Trump that the employees are the heart and soul of what makes Citizens successful. “Because of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Acts, we were able to give every one of our 66 employees an additional \$1,000 over and above their normal annual raises,” commented Bonnell.
